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Mission Statement

Betty L. Hutton, founder of Hutton Foundation, believed education affected positive societal change. Based on this charter, our mission at Hutton Foundation is to perpetuate her vision through the betterment of individual lives.

The Foundation's goals are to make funds available to educational, health and community organizations currently providing such programs and services and to act as a catalyst to encourage development of new programs and services for future generations.

Various funding programs are available to organizations based in Santa Barbara County. Funding in Orange and Riverside counties is limited and offered by invitation only.

The Foundation makes grants to qualified 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations which are tax exempt and are not private foundations as defined by the Internal Revenue Code. Grants for specific projects, operating expenses and capital expenses are considered. No grants are made to individuals or to organizations that discriminate on the basis of age, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, national origin, political affiliation or religious belief.

President's Message

Since its inception, Hutton Foundation has been utilizing its resources to help build fiscal stability within the independent nonprofit sector. We have come to realize that this ever growing sector is in need of both resources and practical tools to develop new models for fiscal stability.

Hutton Foundation has helped build that fiscal stability with its endowment program by offering both the hands-on process and matching funding to establish new endowments for local nonprofits. Our PRI loan program has now assisted dozens of organizations to purchase their own buildings. Most recently the Foundation has brought the "under one roof" concept to our area by acting as a landlord to a number of nonprofit tenants in the same building. We have found by housing various nonprofits in a single location, rental expense can be greatly reduced. And when we add features like shared conference and break room facilities and shared office equipment to the project, many of the fixed costs associated with running a nonprofit organization are further reduced.

Hutton Foundation will continue to provide grants and donations to deserving agencies; however, fiscal capacity building within the independent sector has become and will remain a major focus of the Foundation.

As president of Hutton Foundation, I have never been more optimistic about the future and the critical role the independent sector plays in strengthening our communities.

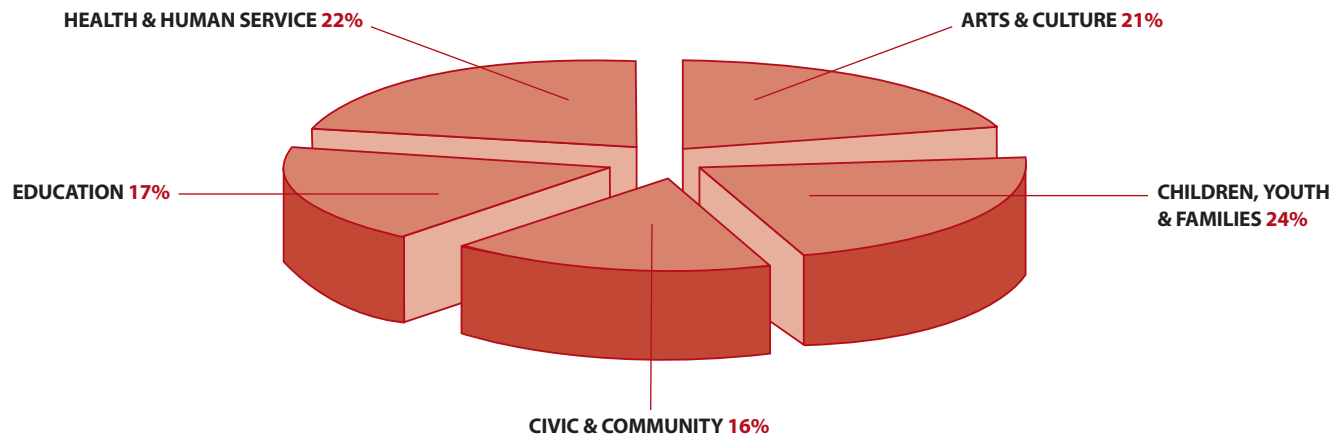

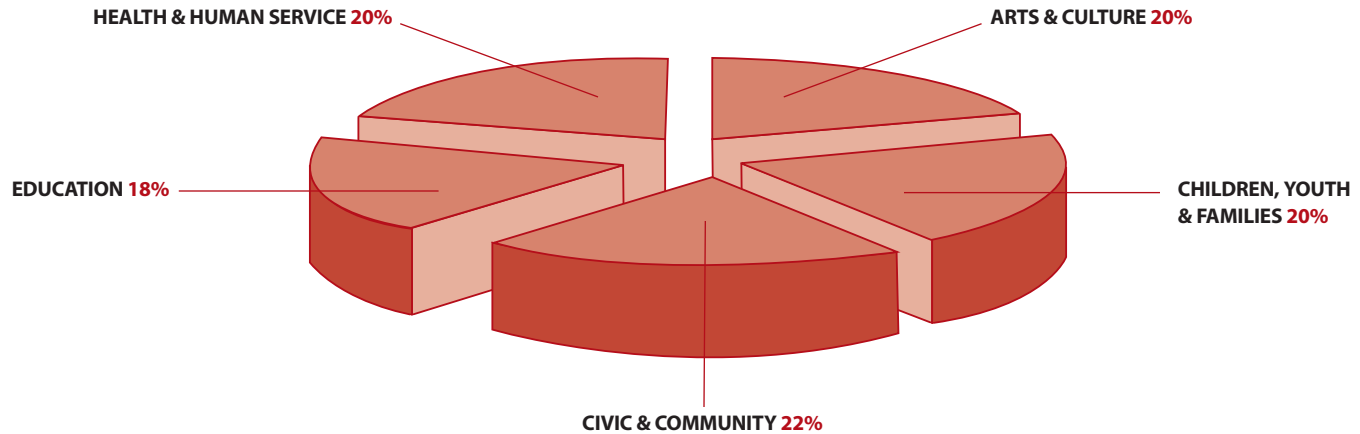

Endowment Grant Program

The Hutton Foundation's Endowment Grant program continues to be a valuable tool for local area nonprofit agencies. The program provides the "hands-on" tools necessary, including a sample endowment policy, to establish an endowment fund as well as matching funding.

Hutton Foundation believes endowments are one of the first steps to longevity and sustainability to the programs and services delivered by nonprofit agencies. Our current program awards \$25,000 grants to qualifying applicants. The recipient agency must match our \$25,000 award 3:1 resulting in an initial \$100,000 endowment.

While the monetary awards of our program are beneficial, we have come to realize that the tools provided in our application package might actually prove more valuable. Many more agencies have requested our endowment application package since the program's inception in 2000 than we have funded.

Arts & Culture

The earliest roots of the SANTA BARBARA MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY extend back to the 1890s when a group of professional scientists and amateurs founded the Santa Barbara Natural History Society with a small museum at 1226 State Street.

Its mission is to enlighten the public by developing and presenting fundamental knowledge of natural history research, so as to teach and inspire a lifelong passion and abiding respect for the natural world.

Throughout the years, the Museum has grown steadily in all programs, establishing major collections in anthropology, earth sciences, and zoology, producing major scientific works and offering educational programs to school children and adults. From the 1960s to the 1980s, the Museum played a leadership role in the emerging field of environmental action when Museum scientists helped establish the whale stranding network and participated in the California Condor Project.

WILDERNESS YOUTH PROJECT is a former Transition House Program that currently serves Santa Barbara County youth, ages 6-17 years old. Established in 2000, the three stage program focuses on the teaching of crucial life lessons in communication, teamwork, self-reliance, joyous work ethics, coping skills, trust, appreciation, problem-solving and community stewardship, all of which are the essential building blocks for kids to develop a strong self-image and a healthy life perspective. WYP is unique in that it uses wilderness, "edge" experiences, rites of passage and cultural mentoring techniques to reach deep inside each of the youth to inspire them to not only picture a positive healthy future but to also have the tools to attain it.

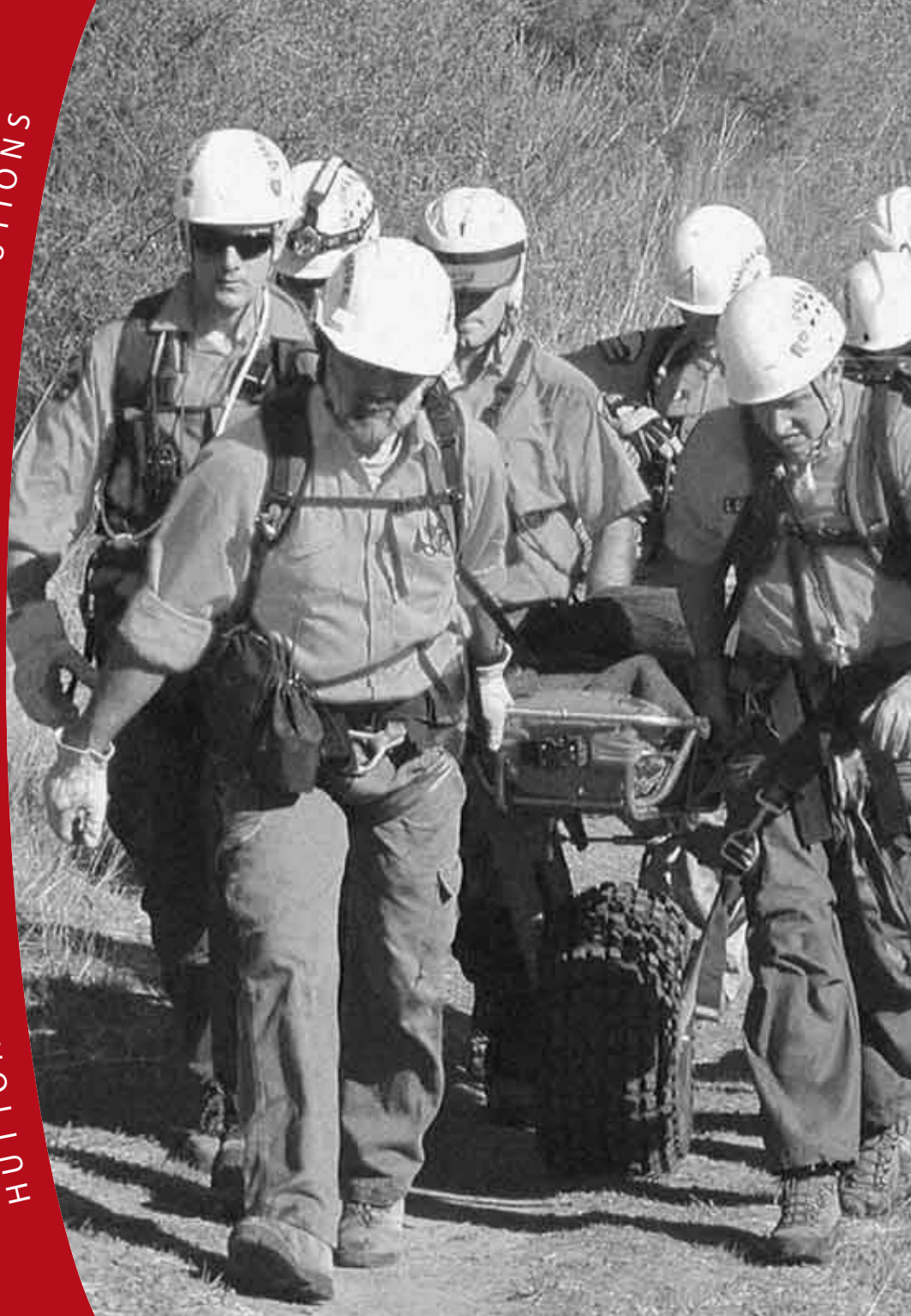
Civic & Community

The SANTA BARBARA COUNTY SEARCH AND RESCUE TEAM is a volunteer branch of the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Department. This highly-trained team uses specialized equipment to handle a variety of emergencies, including high-angle rock rescues, car-over-the-side accidents, downed aircraft, and medical emergencies.

Santa Barbara County Search & Rescue Team is on call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. In an emergency, rescue teams and vehicles are able to start rolling within ten minutes of a call.

The Team is made up of men and women from all walks of life. All team members have wilderness and climbing experience and all are highly skilled in rescue techniques and search procedures. The Santa Barbara County Search & Rescue is one of fifteen teams throughout the state of California.
